What is at issue?

- *Conference puts spotlight on the role of social sciences and humanities (“SSH”) in EU-funded research support*
- *Horizon 2020 made “SSH mainstreaming” a central program feature – now Horizon Europe wants to raise the bar*
- *Contours of next Framework Program are emerging but much work still lies ahead - good moment to take stock and raise some questions*

Where are we coming from?

- *Horizon 2020 has dedicated SSH window (SC6) ...*
- *... but more importantly, SSH is "mainstreamed" across all the societal challenges*
- *Has this worked? Yes and No:*
 - *Progress at conceptual level and in formulating work plan topics*
 - *But less so in project selection, implementation, monitoring and evaluation*

Where are we going?

- *Horizon Europe – across all pillars - aims for “significant environmental and social impact”*
- *Pillar II will “fully integrate” social sciences and humanities across all clusters*
- *Research missions have a particular need for cross-disciplinary approaches and broad outreach*
- *Strategic planning will “incorporate interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral perspectives”*
- *Co-creation with stakeholders and citizens*

What about Cluster 4?

- *Combining “Climate, energy, mobility” offers – and demands! – more cross-disciplinary, cross-sector work*
- *“Approaches broader than technology-driven innovation” will be required*
- *Potential cross-cuts to other clusters, e.g. health (air quality!)*
- *Cities emerging as potential focal points for intra- and intra-cluster work*

How to get impact and more value-added from SSH support – a wish list

- *Resist temptation to retreat into silos, embrace challenge-based nature of Horizon Europe*
- *Engage in and deepen cross-disciplinary dialogues involving SSH as well as STEM researchers*
- *Reach out to stakeholders but don't mistake SSH work for stakeholder/citizen engagement*
- *Pursue and deepen SSH mainstreaming but keep open specific SSH windows as well*
